
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Impact Report 2023



Aqua Clara Kenya (ACK) is a Kenyan social enterprise established in 2012. The business aims to ensure that **safe water is accessible and affordable to the rural poor.** To achieve this goal, ACK focused on production and **distribution of water filters.** However, they have now expanded their model to build a **decentralised**, **data-driven and efficient model for last-mile distribution of WASH products** via a series of WASH Hubs.

Cewas supported ACK by providing assistance in financial planning, networks and guidance on market positioning to better approach impact investors. In addition, cewas channelled seed money to ACK to set-up a pilot WASH Hub.





Our company was already going strong before the programme, but we were looking for catalytic change to help us accelerate our growth. cewas set us on the right path: Based on insights we gained through the programme, we pivoted our business model and today, we are negotiating with several (impact) investors who would have been difficult to access just a year ago.

Example: Iriba, Rwanda

Founded in 2017, the Rwandan social enterprise IRIBA Water Group aims to address the lack of affordable and clean drinking water by providing innovative water solutions for vulnerable communities in Rwanda and neighbouring countries. This is done through the provision of **automated water vending machines** (ATMs) **and kiosks** in urban communities, the installation of **water purification systems** in schools, the operation of water kiosks by franchisees in remote areas, and the **installation and maintenance of water filters** for households, businesses, industries and communities.

As part of its acceleration programme, **Cewas** supported IRIBA to raise funds and build capacities to install an additional **50 water ATMs** in schools and low-income urban communities, serving an additional number of 48,000 people. Today, almost 300,000 people benefit from their products and services.





The acceleration programme of Young Water Solutions and cewas was exactly what my team and I needed to advance IRIBA Water Group to the next level. With the support from our mentor and coaches, we were able to refine our financial model, growth plans and strengthened our pitch deck which unlocked a funding

opportunity for us.

Example: Flowless, Palestine

Founded in 2019 in Palestine, Flowless contributes to water sustainability by helping water utilities and agricultural water users better manage water distribution networks and quality through remote monitoring and control. Flowless systems utilise customised software and hardware solutions to collect and analyse real-time data from sensors in the water network and provide interpretations about water quality and consumption. Results are shared through the Flowless web platform, allowing to detect leaks and resolve problems which helps clients reduce water losses.

Through incubation coaching and a regional acceleration program, **Cewas** supported Flowless in refining its business model, building operational capacities, developing growth strategies and overall investment readiness. Today, Flowless achieved more than 300,000 m3 of water savings and serves more than 23,000 people with safe and reliable water supply.

Founded in 2018, the Jordanian social enterprise SOLVillion strives to create a prosperous and inclusive world by providing technical solutions in the field of water and sanitation. Their Decentralised Wastewater Treatment System (DWWS) was developed as an onsite system to recycle and reuse wastewater for agriculture. The customised treatment systems that are easy to maintain, consume little energy and require less frequent desludging are targeted at rural households that do not have access to the sewerage system.

As part of its incubation and regional acceleration programmes, **Cewas** supported SOLVillion in establishing a business model for different product and service offerings and developing a focused acquisition strategy and market penetration model for its sanitation solutions in Jordan. Today, 42,000 people benefit from sanitation services and 37,000 m3 of wastewater have been safely treated.

Disclaimer

The reported impact are the merits of the entrepreneurs that were supported by Cewas in the last 11 years. All the entrepreneurs were supported for at least one year in an intensive incubation, acceleration or scaling programme. With some we communicated nearly daily, others have gone their way.

We encourage our entrepreneurs to get all the help they can get: From us, other business support organisations and anyone out there that wants to help progressing the impact of entrepreneurs towards SDG 6.

Hence, we do not have the "exclusive" right of the impact our alumni are generated – others contributed too. Therefore, overlaps with contributions to the achievement of the SDGs reported by other organisations cannot be avoided.

Impact Measurement Methodology

In 2019, we published our first impact study, highlighting the results of our efforts to support water and sanitation entrepreneurs in our first seven years of operations, as well as the impact achieved by our alumni.

Now we have set out again to assess the impact of the businesses we support. We reached out to many of the 349 entrepreneurial teams supported in incubation, acceleration and scaling programs between 2011 and 2022 to get their input and feedback. It is the nature of entrepreneurship that not all of them are still around (or were too busy to reply). However, 93 Cewas alumni (from 27 countries) shared results via an online survey and face-to-face or telephone interviews, providing quantitative and qualitative insights into their current work, their impact on the development of the sanitation and water sector, and the contribution of Cewas to the creation or growth of their businesses. All reported figures were validated and random on-site checks were carried out.
